Water Conservation

August 14- October 1, 2025

Water conservation applies to everyone!

(except where necessary to protect the public health & safety)

During Water Conservation, please DO NOT:

- Use water for cleaning impervious surfaces like the sidewalk, driveways, patios, parking lots, streets or other hard surfaces except where necessary to protect public health and safety (brooms or blowers are great alternatives).
- Leave water running while doing outdoor cleaning activities like washing vehicles. The
 hose should be fitted with a shut-off nozzle or device attached to it that causes it to cease
 dispensing water immediately when not in use.
- Use more than 500 gallons to fill a swimming pool, hot tub or water features.
- · Use water in a way that causes runoff.

To Conserve Water on Watering Days, please:

- · Only sparingly water lawns, landscaping or other outdoor vegetation.
- · Merely top off swimming pools, hot tubs or other water features.
- · Only irrigate or water before 9:00 am and after 7:00 pm.
- Shorten shower times, turn water off while brushing teeth, do only full loads of laundry and dishes, and repair leaky fixtures.
- Talk with your neighbors about the importance of water conservation and help spread the word!

Do your part, be water smart. Every Drop Counts!

Why Are We Doing This? Currently, our customer's water demand is higher than can be produced. The system is operating around the clock without a break to keep up with demand. The water level in the aquifer is dropping rapidly. Essentially, we are tapping into our savings account without replenishing it. It will only be a matter of time before we are unable to fulfill the demand for water. Take action now to conserve water.

What Is Being Done? The Public Works Director and City Manager are working to ensure that the equipment and machinery at the Water Plant can keep up with the demand since it is working non-stop. Please help the situation by conserving as much water as possible for the next few months!
