911: Call to report a dangerous fire or other emergency.

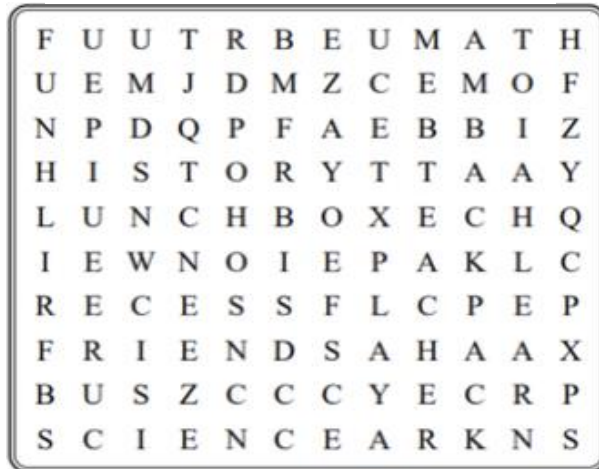
Backyard Burn Hotline: 877-982-0011

PROPERLY DISPOSE OF WASTE

Whether you flush it down the toilet, grind it in the garbage disposal, or pour it down the drain, it all ends up in your septic system which can affect how well the system works. Your septic system contains a collection of living organisms that digest and treat household waste. Pouring anything besides human waste and toilet paper down your drain can kill these organisms and harm your septic system.

Here are some things you should not flush down a septic tank:

- Non-degradable items: Includes feminine hygiene products, condoms, dental floss, diapers, cigarette butts, cat litter, paper towels, and pharmaceuticals.
- Hazardous chemicals: Includes paint, paint thinner, bleach, gasoline, motor oil, weedkiller, solvents, insecticide, and herbicide.
- Grease: Includes fats, butter, wax, cheese, and heavy cream.
- Liquid wastes: Includes pesticides, drain cleaners, and household chemicals.
- Food waste: If you have a garbage disposal, limit its use; food waste can add a lot of solid material to your septic tank.

Remember, your septic system is not a trash can. Septic system failure can contaminate both ground and surface water and lead to costly repairs for the homeowner. Please do your part by properly disposing of your waste.

BACK TO SCHOOL SAFETY TIPS

With the start of school just around the corner, I wanted to share some tips from the national Safety Council to help keep children safe throughout the school year:

Walking to school:

- Walk on the sidewalk; if there is no sidewalk, walk facing traffic.
- Look left, right, then left again to see if cars are coming.

Riding a bike to school:

- Ride on the right side of the road, with traffic and in a single file.
- Always wear a properly fitted helmet and bright clothing.

Riding the bus to school:

- Stand six feet (or 3 giant steps) away from the curb.
- If crossing in front of the bus, walk on the side of the road until they are 10 feet ahead of the bus; your child and the bus driver should always be able to see each other.
