Role:

The Donald City Council is composed of the Mayor and six Councilors elected from the city at large for terms of four years. At each biennial general election, three Councilors shall be elected, each for a term of four years.

Councilors represent the citizens of Donald and play an important role in many of the major decisions that affect the City of Donald as a whole. The fundamental role of a Councilor is to serve the interests of their community. The Mayor and Council positions are unpaid.

Responsibilities:

Among their public duties, the Mayor and City Councilors provide leadership to constituents, arbitrate conflicting interests, and make sound decisions by studying problems and reviewing alternatives to determine the best course of action. The Mayor and City Councilors are responsible for establishing policy, adopting the City's budget and providing direction to the City Manager.

Duties:

Review and approve the annual budget, oversee effectiveness of programs, enter into and approve legal contracts, pass ordinances and resolutions, establish priorities for short-term and long-term futures, regulate business activity through licensing and regulations, regulate public health and safety, communicate policies and programs to residents, respond to constituents needs and complaints, represent the community to other levels of government.

Meetings:

Please be prepared to meet at least two hours on the second Tuesday of each month, as well as be able to commit time to review the Council packet prior to the meeting. In addition to the Regular monthly meeting, there is an annual joint City Council & Planning Commission Goal Setting and occasional Work Sessions, Special Meetings and Executive Sessions that will require your attendance.

City Council & Planning Commission Goals – 2025-2026

A. Support the Health & Safety of our Community

Objectives: Collaborate with the Fire District to facilitate a Stop the Bleed event, Negotiate a long-term contract with Hubbard for police services, Re-establish a CERT qualifying program in the community, develop an emergency response plan, address code enforcement through police services contract, plan a go-bag instructional event.

B. Maintain Secure, Resilient, and Reliable Infrastructure to Support Current and Future Residents, Visitors, and Business Operations

Objectives: Finish construction of Drinking Water Well #3, Replace filtration media across the drinking water system, present to Council options for increasing discharging effluent, schedule infrastructure tour, identify funding options for sewer master plan, create monthly infrastructure report, develop funding source for infrastructure grant matches, Construct additional lagoon, identify funding options for water master plan, Construct Drinking Water Well #4, Identify funding options for parks master plan, Resurfacing Hometown Park, Replace temporary restroom at the Skate Park.

C. Improve Accessibility Through Transportation Facility Planning and Construction

Objectives: Create a street inventory with design types, complete pedestrian safe crossing plan to locate needed crosswalks, report to Council options for "last mile" transportation options, create a transportation system plan, construct sidewalks east of the railroad tracks, initiate traffic calming measures

D. Promote a Thriving, Sustainable, Business-Friendly Local Economy

Objectives: Develop a community conversation strategy with businesses and residents, create a Code-update program with annual sessions (code sections),

E. Protect a Clean, Healthy, and Sustainable Environment

Objectives: Carry out annual garage sale and city-wide cleanup, continue the City's Tree City designation, administer the adopted tree planting strategy, use pre-app meetings to gain information to inform Code updates, engage in energy reduction practices in city operations.

F. Create a Community that is Welcoming and Friendly Through Inclusive Strategies

Objectives: regionalize community event for improved inclusion, create outreach strategy to improve access to city materials/communications, plan community-wide activities that incorporate culturally specific values, make city communications available in English and Spanish.
