If you do not leave your name, number and address, Public Works will not have adequate information to be able to respond to your call.

- Consent Agenda I-IV: Council voted 5-0-0 to approve the July 2023 Action Agenda Summary, Police Logs & Stats, Aurora Rural Fire District Stats, Check Register & Cash Sheet.

— STORMWATER RUN OFF POLLUTION —

As cities are developed, forests and meadows are replaced with buildings and pavement. When it rains, the water (called runoff or stormwater) runs off roofs, driveways, and parking lots into streets. Runoff picks up fertilizer, oil, pesticides, dirt, bacteria, and other pollutants as it makes its way through storm drains and ditches (untreated) to local bodies of water. Polluted runoff is one of the greatest threats to clean water in the United States. Below are some tips to help prevent water pollution and protect our precious drinking water.

- ◇ Disconnect/redirect downspouts (do not connect it to sewer system)
- ◇ Plant a rain garden and/or trees
- ◇ Reduce impervious surfaces; install permeable pavement

— BACK TO SCHOOL SAFETY TIPS —

With the start of school just around the corner, I wanted to share some tips from the National Safety Council to help keep children safe throughout the school year:

Walking to school:

- ◇ Walk on the sidewalk; if there is no sidewalk, walk facing traffic.
- ◇ Look left, right, then left again to see if cars are coming.

Riding a bicycle to school:

- ◇ Ride on the right side of the road, with traffic and in a single file.
- ◇ Always wear a properly fitted helmet and bright clothing.

Riding the bus to school:

- ◇ Stand six feet (or 3 giant steps) away from the curb.
- ◇ If crossing in front of the bus, walk on the side of the road until they are 10 feet ahead of the bus; your child and the bus driver should always be able to see each other.

Curbside Pickup

- Limited curbside pickup is available for residents with special circumstances.
- Please call City Hall at 503-678-5543 by 12pm, Friday, September 8th to sign up.
- Curbside pickup starts at 7am, Saturday, September 9th.
- Please place garbage or debris in bags or containers you don't want back, as any items on the curb will be disposed of.
- No more than 5 bags/bundles (60lb. weight limit each)
- Volunteers will NOT go on private property to retrieve items for pickup.
