### PLANNING COMMISSIONERS NEEDED



### WITHDRAWAL: POLICING LOCAL OPTION LEVY

The Local Option Levy for police services that was published recently in the Woodburn Independent and in the March edition of the Donald Monthly Record has been withdrawn from the May 2023 election. The City will resubmit the ballot title with the Marion County Elections Office for the

November 2023 election. In the meantime, the City will seek to continue police services under the existing agreement through a renewed Intergovernmental Agreement with the Marion County Sheriff's Office beginning July 1, 2023.
