HOW TO WINTERIZE YOUR HOME

Every winter, many homeowners face the expense, and inconvenience of frozen water pipes. Monitor the weather (specifically the freezing temperatures) and be sure you winterize to protect your pipes. Below is a checklist to help you winterize and protect your home for the winter season:

- Indoor: Wrap exposed pipes in the basement, crawl spaces, attics, garages and in kitchen cabinets with proper insulation; available at a plumbing store. For a quick fix, use blankets, newspapers, or towels. If a pipe does freeze, a hair dryer can be used to gradually warm up the pipe. Do NOT pour hot water over a frozen pipe, or use a flame torch; this could cause further damage to the pipe.
- Outdoor: Hose bibs, swimming pool supply lines, pipes on the outside of the house, water sprinkler heads, and irrigation systems.
