After months of work, the City Council is set to approve the City of Donald's first ever Economic Development Strategy at the regularly scheduled City Council meeting on May 12, 2026. The Strategy

stems from a larger regional economic development plan but focusses locally on economic needs that are specific to Donald. The consultant who facilitated the creation of the strategy was funded through a grant from the Ford Foundation.

The Economic Development Strategy has been created to maintain a positive but sustainable rate of growth, support small businesses and entrepreneurship, promote the growth of local services, encourage the health, retention, and expansion of existing businesses, and welcome new companies while fostering job creation.
