### Hello Neighbor,

The City of Donald is undertaking an Urban Growth Boundary (UGB) Expansion Study. In Oregon, cities are required to maintain the necessary land supply to accommodate growth for a projected 20-year horizon. In 2015, the City of Donald determined that, by state guidelines, the city had a deficit of approximately 76.7 acres within the current UGB to meet residential (housing) needs of a growing population over the next two decades.

The City is now studying if and where it should expand its UGB in order to meet this future need for residential land. The State of Oregon has a detailed process for doing this. The study process begins by looking at a large area surrounding a city (1/2 mile radius), then reducing and refining the study area based upon a number of factors such as soil quality, natural hazards, cultural resources, availability of infrastructure, cost to provide services to properties, proximity to the existing UGB, etc. The study is guided by a Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) composed of individuals representing a variety of viewpoints and expertise.

Marion County records indicate that you are an owner of property located within 1/2 mile of the city of Donald, Oregon. Because your property is located within the "Preliminary Study Area," the TAC would like to know your general interest in the opportunity for some or all of your property to be included in a potential UGB expansion this year.

Your feedback about the future of your property is very important to us! Please complete the enclosed 1-page survey and return it using the enclosed pre-stamped envelope by Monday, February 5, 2018.

What does it mean to be included in the urban growth boundary (UGB) expansion study area? Properties included in the UGB expansion study area would be candidates to be included in the urban growth boundary, making them eligible to be annexed into city limits in the future. Once property is annexed into city limits, it could be developed for housing when market demand dictates. The private sector largely determines this timeline. Development takes a willing seller and a willing buyer. Sometimes the property owner is also the developer. Future annexations would be voluntary, and at the expense of the property owner. Properties brought into the UGB but still outside the city limits would remain under Marion County jurisdiction until they are annexed.

There will be multiple opportunities for public review and feedback during this six-month study, including a public open house on **Monday, February 26**<sup>th</sup>.
