



ILLEGAL DUMPING AND PROPER GARBAGE DISPOSAL

With more people getting outside to walk around and enjoy our town, I'd like to take the opportunity to remind people not to litter and to properly dispose of garbage. There are six garbage cans on Main Street, including cans at each park, so people can easily dispose of their garbage and not throw it onto the streets or sidewalks. The garbage cans are mainly to be used by the public to dispose of litter, not household garbage. Public Works has noticed an increase of litter on the grounds and more household garbage filling these garbage cans. Please do not use these cans as a substitute for home garbage service. City Code 91.16 C (2) prohibits the disposal of garbage into public trash receptacles located with the City generated from a residence or business. Thank you for participating and doing your part to keep Donald clean!

CHECK YOUR DETECTORS

Did you check your smoke and carbon monoxide (CO) detectors when "springing forward"? How old is your detector? Like most things, these detectors have an expiration date. You can find the date of manufacture on the back side of the detectors; if it doesn't have one, it's likely much older than 10 years, and should be replaced.

DONALD MUNICIPAL CODE: 72.20 RECREATIONAL VEHICLE PARKING

Below are the rules in place to regulate recreational vehicle parking in Donald:

- A. No person shall park or place any presently occupied camper, motor home, or travel trailer at any place within the city of a period exceeding 6 hours.
- B. If the camper, motor home, or travel trailer is self-contained, the camper, motor home, or travel trailer may be parked or placed within the city for a period not to exceed 72hrs., unless an RV parking permit is applied for an issued by the City Manager.
- C. At no time will the camper, motor home or travel trailer be allowed to connect to any resident's water or sewer systems.
- D. Any other use of a camper, motor home, or travel trailer is expressly prohibited by this subchapter within the city.
- E. Use of any vehicle for sleeping quarters longer than the allowed period of 6 hours is expressly prohibited by this subchapter within the city.
- F. Use of a recreational vehicle that is self-contained is allowed for a night watchperson in the commercial or industrial zone only. A permit must be obtained from the City Manager at no cost to the owner of the property.
- Other than as described in 72.20 (F), occupancy granted under the RV Parking Permit shall not exceed 14 consecutive days.
