Curbside Pickup

- Limited curbside pickup is available for residents with special circumstances.
- Please call City Hall at 503-678-5543 by 12pm, Friday, September 8th to sign up.
- Curbside pickup starts at 7am, Saturday, September 9th.
- Please place garbage or debris in bags or containers you don't want back, as any items on the curb will be disposed of.
- No more than 5 bags/bundles (60lb. weight limit each)
- Volunteers will NOT go on private property to retrieve items for pickup.



CODE COMPLIANCE

The City has several codes in place to help ensure that Donald is a safe, comfortable and beautiful place for businesses, residents and visitors. Here are a few examples of such codes:

- Basketball hoops are not allowed in any public right-of-way, including sidewalks.
- Noxious vegetation must be cut down or destroyed as often as needed to prevent a health, fire or traffic hazard (includes grass & weeds exceeding 10").
- No person shall allow, cause, create or permit the continuance of unreasonable noise. This includes but is not limited to the use of a stereo, or sound amplifying device so loud as to disturb persons at least 5ft. beyond the property line for which the sound originates.
- No accumulation of debris, junk and materials on private property within the site of the public.

ILLEGAL FIREWORKS: IS IT WORTH IT?

A class B misdemeanor, a fine of up to \$2,500 per violation and a civil penalty of up to \$500 are just a few consequences of using illegal fireworks.

Fireworks that fly in the air, explode, or behave in an unpredictable manner are NOT allowed in Oregon without the proper permit issued by the Oregon State Fire Marshall's Office.

The City received several complaints about Donald residents setting off illegal fireworks on the 4th of July and the following week, creating a nuisance, disturbing neighbors, and endangering the town as a whole. The City enforces State Laws regarding illegal fireworks, and in addition can cite violators into the Donald Municipal Court and impose a fine of \$500 per day, per violation.

The devastating Eagle Creek Fire, which burned more than 48,000 acres, leaving many without homes, destroying wildlife, leaving a long-lasting mark on the State of Oregon was caused by an illegal firework.

The teen who admitted to setting the fire was sentenced up to 5 years probation, 1,920 hours of community service and ordered to pay 36.6 million in restitution.

Stop using illegal fireworks, it's not worth it!
