## CITIES OF DONALD & HUBBARD TEAM UP FOR POLICING

**A**fter a failed Ballot Measure intended to provide full-time policing services from the Marion County Sheriff's Office, City leadership sought alternative solutions. After the public Work Session and the May 14<sup>th</sup> regular meetings, the Donald City Council voted unanimously to move forward with an Intergovernmental Agreement with the City of Hubbard to provide policing services to the City of Donald without any increase in costs to tax payers. The terms of the agreement includes, but is not limited to:

- Assignment of labor, supervision and equipment including a patrol car to work in Donald a minimum of twenty (20) hours per week in varying shifts.
- In addition to the twenty (20) hours of agreed-upon shifts per week, Hubbard shall periodically patrol Donald in marked police vehicles.
- Patrol vehicles and uniforms patches shall identify officers and cars as Hubbard and Donald police.
- Hubbard will conduct Municipal Court activities as they relate to crime and traffic.
- The Intergovernmental Agreement for Law Enforcement Services will be effective July 1, 2024.

## JUNE CITY COUNCIL MEETING & BUDGET HEARING

### UTILITY RATES INCREASE JULY 1<sup>ST</sup>

On July 1, 2024, an inflation adjustment for the cost to operate, replace and maintain the Water & Sewer treatment systems will take effect. The Donald City Council voted to adopt Resolution No. 566-24, increasing Water & Sewer Rates based on the January 2024 CPI-U, Pacific-Size, Class B/C. The rate details are reflected in the charts below:

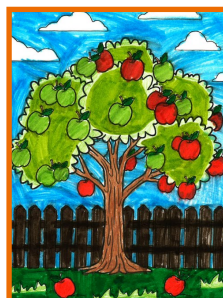

### WATER SAVING TIPS: By Alonso Limones, Public Works Director

The majority of household water use comes from toilets, washing machines, showers, baths, faucets, and leaks, but what you can do to save water is fairly simple. These water saving tips will put you on the path to conserving water in your household and save you money.

- **Toilets:** Flush only when needed. Do not use the toilet as a trash can. Check for leaks twice a year by adding a few drops of food coloring to the tank. If the colored water enters the bowl on its own, then you'll know you have a leak that needs to be repaired.
- **Washing Machine:** Use the right amount of water for each load of laundry. Save water by making sure to adjust the settings on your machine to the proper load size. Do only full loads. Avoid using extra cycles whenever possible. Choose a water-saving model.
- **Showers and Baths:** Install low-volume showerheads. They are inexpensive and can pay for themselves in water, sewer, and energy savings in less than a year. With a low-flow showerhead you can save 15 gallons of water during a 10-minute shower.
- **Use a dishwasher:** Dishwashing accounts for less than 2 percent of indoor water use, but using a machine is actually more water efficient than hand washing, especially if you run full loads. Energy efficiency dishwashers save many gallons of water over a lifetime of use.
