CITY MANAGER ERIC UNDERWOOD LEAVES



Eric Underwood, who began serving the Donald community as City Manager on October 1, 2021, has left to become the new City Administrator for the City of Hubbard. Projects accomplished during his time with Donald include obtaining an ARPA Grant for drinking well #3 (which will be completed by the end of 2026), bringing in police services through a contract with the City of Hubbard, renewing the Enterprise Zone to strengthen the business community, constructing the gazebo facility on Williams and Main Streets, and attracting five new businesses to Donald. He recalls one of his funniest memories during his tenure, taking place during his second week in Donald, that involved running with a herd of goats down Main Street. Those goats were eventually corralled in Hometown Park where the owner came to retrieve them. Eric's vision for Donald's future consists of a sustainable and thriving business community, smart growth, safe and secure provisions of utility services, and the preservation of Donald's close knit, safe, and livable community.

The time he spent in Donald was a reminder to him of why he entered public service, which was to have the opportunity to make positive impacts on a community. He's planning to take what he's learned in Donald to be a resource to the City of Hubbard. The small town feel of Donald, its unique opportunities and challenges along with the friends he has made during his time here will all be missed by him.

CITY COUNCIL UPDATES

The City Council, at a Special City Council Meeting on June 16, 2026, voted to engage the Mid-Willamette Valley Council of Governments (MWVCOG) to lead the recruitment of a new City Manager for the City of Donald. They will participate in a Council Work Session on Monday July 6 at 6:45 pm, led by the MWVCOG, to develop the Manager profile and advise on the recruitment process. Public Works Director Alonso Limones will be acting as Interim City Manager with various members of the City Hall staff team taking on additional duties until a new City Manager is hired.

CITY COUNCIL TAKES DONALD INFRASTRUCTURE TOUR

The City Council was given a tour of Donald’s Water Facility, where a project to dig Well #3 should be completed by the end of the year. A federal grant is being sought to dig Well #4, likely on the west side of town, to provide back up in the future.



Public Works Director Alonso Limones and contract engineer Matt Huxley guided the tour. The group also viewed the Sewer Facility, where they walked up to the berm of Lagoon #4, which provided a good view of the various lagoons, as the purpose of each was explained to the group.

HELP PREVENT WILDFIRES THIS SUMMER Aurora Fire District

You’ve probably heard that this summer is expected to bring an above-average potential for large wildfires across Oregon. With roughly 70% of Oregon’s wildfires caused by people—many unintentionally—we all have a role to play in preventing human-caused fires.

Debris Burning

- Clear at least 10 feet around burn piles to bare soil.
- Never burn on windy days.
- Keep water and a shovel nearby.
- Drown, stir, and check burn piles for heat before leaving them unattended.

Mowing & Equipment Use

- Mow and operate gas-powered equipment early in the day when temperatures are cooler and humidity is higher.
- Ensure equipment is equipped with spark arrestors. Allow engines to cool before refueling.

Grills & Smokers

- Maintain a 10-foot safety zone around grills and smokers.
- Never use grills on wooden decks or beneath overhangs.
- Dispose of ashes and coals in a metal container with a tight-fitting lid.

A few simple precautions can help protect our community, homes, and natural resources. Thank you for doing your part to reduce wildfire risk this summer.
