Ch. 90.06 states that we, as property owners, are responsible. I ask that you go to our website and look up the referenced codes which I have listed in this article.

Ch. 91.16 contains a list of nuisances affecting public safety such as: woodpiles, wood, lumber, rocks, bricks, blocks, etc. Please respect your neighbors by keeping your property safe for others. It only takes a few minutes.

• New Business I: Council held the second reading of and voted 6-1-0 to approve Ordinance No. 183-2024. The Ordinance, which is available for review on the City's website, will become effective March 13, 2024.

• New Business II: Council voted 7-0-0 to appoint Trevor Alley, John Crawford and Bryan Hall to the Donald Planning Commission with each term ending December 31, 2026.

- New Business III: Council voted 7-0-0 to approve the Budget Calendar for FY '24 -'25.
- New Business IV: Council voted 7-0-0 to approve a revised salary schedule.

• New Business V: Council voted 7-0-0 to approve Resolution No. 584-24: Amending the City of Donald's System Development Charges.

• New Business VI: Council reviewed the results from the Waste & Recycling Collection Services Survey, part 2 and voted 7-0-0 to implement yard debris collection services.

YARD DEBRIS COLLECTION SERVICES TO BE IMPLEMENTED

The results from part 2 of the Waste & Recycling Collection Services survey were reviewed at the February 13, 2024 City Council meeting. The question posed to residents and businesses was

"would you be willing to pay an additional monthly fee for yard debris services?" Based on the results from the survey, the City Council voted to implement a bi-weekly yard debris service at a cost of \$7.73, per month, per customer. Yard debris collection service is estimated to begin in the Spring of 2024 and will be provided by N. Marion Recycling & Disposal. Pickup schedule, accepted items and other information will be provided as it becomes available. If you have questions about this service, please contact N. Marion Recycling & Disposal.

PLAN AHEAD, PLANT SAFELY

Property owners should be aware of where the septic tank is located and refrain from planting trees and hedges near it. Before starting any property improvement project, contact City Hall and request a utility line locate. If the sanitary sewer system is damaged from root intrusion, the property owner is responsible for the cost of the repairs.

Tree roots penetrating septic lines or tanks are generally the most expensive sewer maintenance repair experienced by the City. Once inside, roots will cause a complete blockage if immediate action isn't taken. As roots continue to grow, they expand and exert considerable pressure at cracks or joints where they have entered the system. The pipe then becomes matted with grease, tissue paper and other debris causing slow drainage and sewer service backups. The force by the root growth will break the pipe and may result in a total collapse. Before planting, plan ahead—call for utility locates then plant safely.
